




Vidya Vanam's director Prema

Vidya Vanam organized an online meeting for teachers across INDIA on "Integrated Art With Mathematics". Mrs Meena Suresh and Mrs Saroja Sundararajan, both well-known Maths educators from Chennai, offered tips and advice to making Maths interesting to students. Over 130 teachers from schools and colleges who participated received certificates.

### Challenges of online learning.

With the Covid-19 led lockdown, we have moved to an online mode teaching, which has thrown up many challenges in such a remote area.

For Standards 9-12, classes were initially held on Zoom. Over the past month, the school has moved to Google Meet, as it was found to be more flexible in terms of time. Each Standard has classes for just two hours which is scheduled to take into account that families with more than one child will be sharing devices. Yet connectivity issues and frequent power cuts during the rainy season prevent children from accessing these classes and attendance tends to be erratic. Nevertheless, children from Standards X and XII are making great efforts to attend and prepare for their forthcoming board exam. Most of the children have a smartphone and parents have invested in that and in getting better data packs. Wherever possible, the teachers are reaching out to students with hard copies of notes on their lessons.

### Challenges of online learning.

For Middle School, video lessons are posted every day; one subject per day, followed by a worksheet on the lesson. The answers are uploaded as photos on WhatsApp. For example, in science, the teacher showed experiments related to germination, soil erosion and presence of starch. In Math, the teacher shows how to solve sums involving integers and fractions and word problems. Languages involve reading out and narrating stories and poems and developing language activities from them.

In Junior School, the teachers send videos of a song, a story, craft work, which the children can learn and repeat.

A few spelling exercises and activities for math and science are also given.

However, for the last two segments, the parents have to cooperate and share the lessons with the children. At times, they have expressed their inability to do this, especially when they have to go to work. Some have in fact said that they do not see their children as they leave early and return late.
