#### NOVEMBER

All students who graduated from Std XII (100% of the 2020-21 batch) secured admission in well-known institutions such as Kumaraguru College of Liberal Arts, Avinashilingam College for Women, Kongunadu College and Sri Ranganathar Engineering College in Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu for undergraduate degrees in Music, Food and Nutrition, Visual Communication, Engineering, English Literature and Clinical Psychology.
